#### **FV World Series of Poker**

Clubhouse Fridays | 6:00PM

The Fairway Villas Friday night poker club is looking to "up the ante." Every other Friday night the poker group runs a tournament. This year, they will be awarding points to the top 3 players of each night:

1<sup>st</sup> place, 3 points 2<sup>nd</sup> place, 2 points 3<sup>rd</sup> place, 1 point

At the end of the year, there will be a trophy and a special prize for the top winners.

Tournament rules are as follows:

Tournaments are every other week, on Friday, at 6:00 sharp. The first tournament starts promptly at 6:15 after participants buy their chips. In a tournament, the chips only have point value, no cash value. After the first tournament has ended, about 8:15, the second tournament starts as long as there are at least 8 players. The first 3 places in a tournament wins a portion of the "pot." First place wins 50%, Second place wins 30%, and Third place wins 20% of the total pot. The "buy-in" for each tournament is \$10, with an additional \$1 which goes for the highest hand. Thus, if we have 10 players, the total of the buy-ins is \$110, with \$50 for first, \$30 for second, \$20 for third, and \$10 goes to the player that had the highest hand. On the weeks that we do not have a tournament, we have a cash game.
